Ann was Editor of West Kent News for some years and oversaw the first time it looked like a magazine with photos and adverts. This was before computers were common place and there was much cutting and pasting with scissors and glue.

Ann joined Brenda Young as a Federation Archivist and between them they sorted out years of paperwork as well as some old banners and craft items found in a store room at the top of Hunt House. The Federation still has most of these items. She passed on her knowledge to the current Archivist Team which they really appreciated. Chris Klempau

## Treasurer's Corner



It is important to note that if a WIs income is £5,000 or more, they must register with the Charity Commission. There is some confusion as to what is included in income.

#### **ACTING AS AGENT**

There are three types of receipts/payments that this applies to:

The share of the membership subscription that is to be passed onto the Federation and the NFWI

Payment or booking by individual members on Federation events where members book and pay as individuals and the WI is doing nothing more than acting as a conduit to pass on information from the Federation and member's payment to the Federation.

Payment for the NFWI or Federation raffle tickets that are collected and passed to the raffle operator.

These receipts/payments are **<u>NOT</u>** included in your Financial Statement.

#### A WI IS NOT ACTING AS AGENT in the following situations.

The WI organises an event or visit for a group of members and charges members a fee. In this case the WI committee is exercising discretion in organising the event and the booking is made in the name of the WI (include under activities and events). If you are not sure, then you should assume the WI is not acting as agent.

The WI is paying for members to attend a Federation event from WI funds (include under activities and events).

The WI orders and purchases diaries, calendars and other items from the Federation and sells to members where there is a single order in the name of the WI (include under publications)

The WI raises funds and donates them to another charity (include under WI fundraising).

These receipts/payments are included as income and expenditure and are included on the Financial Statement which could mean that the WI income exceeds £5,000.

I hope this clarifies the difference but please do check your income for last year recorded on your Financial Statement and make sure you comply with Charity Commission regulations.

## **REPORT OF A RECENT FEDERATION EVENT**

## Introduction to Flower Drawing



Entering a light airy room on one of the first hot sunny days of the year, we were welcomed by our tutor, Jan Moffitt. The surroundings were ideal for our Drawing Flowers tutorial. From the start, Jan gave everyone a high quality colour printed sheet of flowers to work from. After a demonstration that from a few competent graphite pencil lines, she was able to draw a three dimensional picture of a poppy, we all had a go, while Jan toured the room giving us invaluable, individual tuition. Looking intently at a poppy we drew a basic shape and then through shading, contouring of lines, soft smudges, we were able to draw a three dimensional impression of it.



Throughout the morning we had demonstrations and then created further pictures from the worksheet, a daffodil, tulip, and lily. We were shown how to use colour pencils to make different colour combinations and achieve realistic tones, shading and shaping.

The last piece from the worksheet was an extremely ambitious subject; a white rose, and we then moved on to working from fresh flowers.

Jan brought vases with lovely fresh flowers that we worked from next and some members brought flowers from home. The day finished with working from some beautiful flowering fuchsia plants.



This class was ideal for true beginners and also improvers; it was apparent throughout the day that Jan was able to cater for all abilities. It was a wonderful 'study day' and everyone was pleased with the flower studies they took home. We also gained confidence in creating further independent works of our own.


## We do not often realise how much science plays a part in in our everyday living. This day will give you an insight into several different areas:



You will hear from **KATY LEWIS**, who is a Monitoring Field Team Manager at the Environment Agency. Katy is a fisheries scientist by background and now manages environmental monitoring. Her teams collect samples from rivers, lakes and seas around England. She is going to talk about how the Environment Agency uses molecular techniques in their work. She will discuss examples of how DNA is used to monitor invasive

species, to tell how much nutrients are in the rivers and track viruses, like COVID, in the sewage systems.

**DAVID TADD** was, prior to retirement, Head of Forensic Investigation and Operations at New Scotland Yard. He served with the Metropolitan Police for over 40 years, time spent entirely within Forensic Services. In the post of Head of Forensic Investigation he was responsible for an operational unit .



Consisting of a multi disciplined forensic workforce of 950 officers in this role he undertook the strategic lead for the delivery of the forensic response to the investigation of crime in London

**DAVID BROWN** is an Environmental Health Manager part of the Food and Safety Team at Medway Council. They cover all aspects of environmental health regulations for businesses operating within Medway. Their officers visit a full range of business premises to provide a range of interventions including : Conducting food hygiene standards and health and safety inspections. Providing advice to businesses and consumers, taking samples of food and water, investigating complaints and cases of infectious diseases. David also investigates serious work-related accidents.

Ann was WI through and through and she will be missed. Even at the end of a long illness which left her incapable of speech or much movement she remained a member and was interested in what went on in her WI.

Ann joined in May 1967, was on committee from 1971 doing various 'jobs' then Treasurer in 1985 and President in 1987, Treasurer again 1997-2007 when she was again President. She was also on the Hall Committee (we own our own Hall) and Chairman for three years. She took part in many of the activities, quizzes etc and played a mean game of whist, and later learned to play Mah Jong having offered her home to the growing group. She was a volunteer reader for the WI Home and Country (later WI Life) which was and is recorded for Blind, Partially Sighted and Dyslexic members throughout the country, and distributed by Kent Association for the Blind.

Alongside this she was District Secretary of North Downs 1990-2000 organising District Activities and the Annual District Meeting. Plus being a VCO for 15 years and on the Executive Committee of West Kent Federation and Federation Treasurer for three years and Independent Financial Examiner for at least eight years. She also edited and proof read West Kent News for over 14 years and was the Federation Archivist.

She rarely missed a meeting and believed that the WI way was the only way to do things. She had a wonderful garden and was generous with her plants and advice on all things, whether you wanted it or not, she was WI through and through and definitely a one off, would that there were more like her.
