Treasurer's Corner



We are rapidly approaching the end of the financial year of 31 March and there are a few things to check are in order, to enable the smooth reconciliation of the WI accounts.

Monthly reconciliation of the bank account should be carried out as a matter of course. Any differences can then be sorted out quickly. It is important that this is conducted religiously.

Make sure all outstanding payments are made immediately they are received and any expenses paid. If petty cash is used, then reconcile and if possible, avoid having a large float at the end of the year.

It is vital that all subscriptions received have been paid over to the Federation and that receipts for the year, payments made in the year and any brought forward figures all balance. Make sure that all Acting as Agent receipts, payments and brought forward figures for Federation events also all balance.

Most accounts that I have examined in the past where the accounts do not balance is usually due to Acting as Agent differences. Always make sure that tickets ordered are paid for by the members attending.

When the monthly statement is received from Andrew, our Bookkeeper, there will be items on the invoice that are not acting as agent e.g. insurance. If you will not be getting the money from your members for any of the items on the invoice, then you are NOT Acting as Agent and a different column should be used.

Remember, the WI portion of the subscriptions is the only subscription receipt taken as income. The Federation and National portion of the subscriptions is not part of the WI income. If you are using spreadsheet accounts, then this will automatically excluded from the Financial Report.

Lastly, make sure that all your invoices, receipts etc are filed in order, ready to give to the account's examiner along with all copies of bank statements. If you use a WI Independent Examiner then a check list of requirements will be sent out by the end of February along with details of who your IFE will be and their contact details.

RESOLUTIONS 2024-25

Your WI secretary will by now have received the information about the first round of voting for this year's resolutions. Having started with 32 potential resolutions, the shortlisting meeting voted to put forward 4 potential resolutions.

Within your WI each member has a vote to choose one resolution out of these four, to put forward to the final vote at the NFWI AGM on the 4 June. The total of your WI vote must be sent to Ethel Hunt Lodge (<u>Fedsec@wkfwi.org.uk</u>) by the 9 February by your WI at the latest so that they can be sent off to the NFWI. Here are the four choices:

Resolution 1: Let's talk about Incontinence. Resolution 2: Bystanders can be lifesavers. Resolution 3: Join the Repair revolution. Resolution 4: Eliminate landfill of medication packaging.

More information is available in the December issue of WI Life and also on "My WI" under Public Affairs / Resolutions. There is a page that that gives more detailed background information for members to view if they want it. Please would all WIs make sure that your members have the opportunity to vote on this first round and then the final round in April/May.

Resolutions 2025-26

Whilst you are considering this year's resolution choices, some of you may be considering proposing a resolution of your own for next year. You do have time to prepare your proposal so I am offering some advice to help you in the process.

Every year members from every Federation are invited to submit resolution proposals on issues that are topical to the current time. All resolutions that meet the criteria will be considered and when submitted for final discussion to the NFWI, the WI is identified rather than the proposers so it is judged on the resolution itself.

It is worth watching the online presentation on "How to write a Resolution" and if you are further interested, in doing the WI online "Resolution Co-Ordinator" training which will provide more helpful information on what the NFWI and Federation Resolution Coordinators are looking for in a successful proposal for submission. Your Federation Resolution Coordinators are here to help and support you when you need us.

Whatever you are thinking of proposing please do check that any proposal would apply to the whole of the UK as several resolutions discussed in 2024 could not be moved forward because the changes asked for would not apply across the whole country. The devolved governments of Scotland, Wales and the Islands often do things differently from England.

I hope these suggestions are helpful. Our best wishes to any of you preparing to put forward a Resolution for next year. If I or Thushara can be of any help, please do not hesitate to contact one of us.
