It is in fact in the WI constitution but below is from the WI website and can be found at Microsoft Word - 2019 Annual Meeting Pooling of Fares guidance (final) (thewi.org.uk):

ADMINISTRATION OF THE FUND • The Annual Meeting Pooling of Fares fund is a non-profit making fund that covers the costs of travel to the Annual Meeting • Each federation pays an equal and set amount of money into the Pooling of Fares fund each year • Each WI pays an equal and set amount of money into the Pooling of Fares fund each year • The amount paid into the fund by federations and WIs is set each year by the NFWI Board of Trustees and is based on the balance in the fund and the cost of travel to the previous Annual Meeting .


In February, we welcomed Andy Dinsdale , director of Strandliners , an organisation



Introduction to **Drawing Flowers**

With tutor Jan Moffitt Tuesday 18 June at Frittenden Thursday 20 June at EHL Saturday 22 June at Orpington Workshop from 10 am to 3:30 pm. Doors open at 9:30

Please bring a packed lunch and a mug for coffee. Ticket price £29. Members Only

Classes are centred around positivity, creativity and enjoyment – an encouraging space to learn, practice and experiment. They are for all creative abilities – including beginners.

Jan will be doing demonstrations, drawing along with you and coming round to give individual advice.



We will start our drawings by observing and drawing the big shapes that form the flower. Then learn to create shading to give the illusion of form and practice different drawing techniques to create texture.

The second part of the class will be using coloured pencils and learning how to build up depth of colour by overlaying a mixture of colours.



You will need :-Cartridge paper or pad - ideally A3 Pencil – ideally 4B or softer, eraser Coloured pencils - a set of about 12 pencils is suggested – Derwent is tutors preferred make.

Jan will bring paper and **graphite** pencils for you to use if you need them.

During the day we will work from work-sheets and real flowers – some flowers will be supplied but please bring your own flowers if you'd prefer.

Greening your WI.

Have you thought about how green your WI is and what you could do to make it greener? Here are some ideas:

Remember the Re-use, Reduce, Recycle mantra. Try especially hard to reduce plastic use such as single use plastics and especially cling film. There are reusable covers for containers readily available. At your meetings do you use the hall's cups and saucers or perhaps everyone brings their own reusable mug and takes it home afterwards? Keep an eye on unnecessary printing of documents that could be read online by the majority of members. Carsharing both to meetings and events. Could you get raffle prizes and secret Santa gifts from charity shops? Regular second hand books and jigsaw puzzle stalls are a great way to recycle items whilst raising a little extra for your WI as are preloved scarf and handbag sales.

Our WI's craft group has used old paperback books to make Christmas trees, angels and hedgehogs. Our walking group uses public transport wherever possible and often includes a free museum in the walk. Were you aware the local library can provide multiple copies of a chosen book for your book club avoiding the need to purchase books? Can you recycle difficult to recycle items? Learning from another Green team member we are having a bra collection for "Against Breast Cancer" charity. We also collect medicine blister packs for recycling at local health stores (Superdrug take ours) and spectacles go to local opticians or local charities. Can you get involved with the Big Plastic Count in March either as individuals or as a WI? Does your WI have a Green Team or Climate Ambassador?

Don't forget to share your ideas with other WIs and remember even small changes in greening your individual WI can have a positive overall effect.
