The Committee decided that, following the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, the



bursary should benefit the whole membership, investigations were made and we welcomed Sue Kimber to deliver the workshops.

Sue introduced us to the delights of wet-felting using wool harvested from her family's herd of sheep and alpaca. She demonstrated how to create a colourful tableau, after which we had great fun pulling, laying, wetting, rolling, rinsing and, finally, 'slamming' our pieces. It was amazing to see how a collection of fibres came together to create a strong vibrant piece of fabric.



Sue also gave us tips on how to re-size woollen garments following mishaps in the washing machine and we talked about the effects of warm and cold water on different fibres, as well as learning about her life living 'off grid' on her smallholding. REMINDER ABOUT NATASHA'S LAW

Since October 2021 Natasha's Law has come into force. This means any pre packed food or food for sale has to be labelled with name and full ingredient information with the allergens emphasised.

The West Kent Federation recommends that it would be good practice to label homemade cakes etc. with a list of ingredients. Also with the proviso that the food has not been prepared or cooked in an allergen free environment. Although this does not apply to WI self catered events.

I chose to do a Mosaic course. I have never tried this craft and technique before and was keen to learn how to complete a small mosaic table for my garden. I booked myself onto a two day master class in mosaics with Sarah Bourne (Mosaic Mum - <u>www.mosaicmum.co.uk</u>) who runs courses from her home and studio located at Chevening, which is only a short drive from my home. I had an idea in mind for the layout and drew a Mandela design that I took with me to the course. Sarah's teaching method was easy to follow and her advice and expertise in constructing my mosaic was very helpful. A lot of time was spent in sorting out the pieces to fit successfully – it was almost like putting together a jigsaw pattern. Sarah was patient and instructive in how to use

the tools needed for cutting up china and porcelain and making shapes from the designs on the vintage plates available, without being too rushed.

I got great enjoyment from the two day course and the time seemed to fly by. As well as providing me regularly with refreshments, Sarah made a delicious home cooked lunch that we had out in her garden, overlooking the fields (an idyllic setting). My table is now out in the patio area in my garden, so I can sit out and enjoy using it. I am delighted with the result of my course.

The bursary was a great way for me to learn a new skill, which I can now continue with to create many other items with the mosaic technique I have been taught.
