JANINE WEBBER

Catford WI's January meeting was a rare privilege to hear Janine Webber, a Jewish survivor of the Nazi holocaust, tell her story. Now a very sprightly 90 year old, and after many years of silence, Janine had been encouraged by her Grandchildren to tell her story which she now does, visiting schools and groups across London. Born in 1932 in Lvov, now in Ukraine, Janine's warm and loving childhood was destroyed by the rise of Nazism. Janine told of her family hiding in a hole dug underneath a wardrobe and described hearing the shots that killed her father and grandmother. She lost her mother to starvation and disease and her younger brother in a death camp. The story of her escape and life in a church orphanage, where she had to ignore her

Acrylic Painting for Beginners Workshop Tutor Charles Evans Tickets £32.00



Back by popular demand, Charlie is a well-known teacher and demonstrator of painting in both watercolour and acrylic and is the main representative for Daler Rowney art materials. The workshop will introduce members to painting in acrylics and will cater for all levels from beginner to the more experienced improver.


Please bring acrylic or watercolour brushes. Members may be able to use what they have or they can buy some inexpensive brushes from Charlie on the day. Painting can be done on watercolour paper supported on a

board, or on canvas. Members can bring their own paper or canvas if

desired and acrylic paints if they have them. Charlie will be demonstrating on canvas.

Kit Charge, if required, payable on the day. For £5 Charles will supply acrylic paint needed for the workshop on a plastic plate for use as a palette, including one sheet of paper. He can provide additional paper if needed at £1 per sheet.

Ideally please bring a 3/4" flat brush and a number 8 round brush or similar, as well as a pencil, rubber, water container, kitchen roll, masking tape and support for the paper. There will be a few boards
