Treasurer's Corner



When you read this in early September; the main holiday period will be over, children will be going back to school and those WIs who took a break for the summer will be meeting again. This all means we are approaching the mid-point of the financial year for West Kent WIs.

Whether you are an experienced WI Treasurer or just in your first few months, it is never too early to think about making your end of financial year tasks as stream-lined as possible. Measures and activities undertaken now and throughout the year which may help include:

- Comparing the WI's actual receipts and payments to any budget which was prepared for the year. How are things looking? Do you need to bring any issues to the attention of the Committee to discuss?

- Checking that the WI has paid over the Federation and NFWI portion of the subscriptions promptly and are doing that throughout the year for new Full members.

- Paying bills (eg hall hire, speakers and WKF invoices) promptly. If some bills are only paid once or twice a year (eg hall hire) making sure there is the money to pay them.

- Banking the monthly meeting receipts promptly. Committee members are claiming agreed expenses regularly and being paid promptly.

- Remembering to reconcile the Accounts Book entries to the Bank Statement regularly to identify as early as possible if any receipts or payments might have gone astray. This will give you time to find out why a cheque hasn't been cashed or if a banked receipt has not been credited and act to rectify the issue,

Underpinning the above is keeping good and clear records of receipts and payments and promptly entering transactions into the Accounts Book.

Treasurers should remember that there is no need for them to be a one-man band. Many WI Treasurers have an assistant who collects and counts cash receipts at meetings or helps in other ways. This member can cover if the Treasurer is absent or even be prepared to be the next Treasurer. If you want to know more about this, the Federation Office will be happy to take enquiries.

This month's inspiring Treasurers quote is 'A treasurer's work is like a dance, where every step counts'.

WKFWI has received an invitation, from Amelia Blesius who is a PhD student at the UCL Dementia Research Centre, to take part in a survey.

The study uses a digital assessment app called Ignite+, featuring engaging, game-like memory and thinking tasks that take approximately 30 minutes to complete at home. At this stage, we are inviting **healthy adults aged 20–80 to take part**. By collecting data across different age groups, we can establish “normal” cognitive benchmarks. These benchmarks are essential for identifying very early cognitive changes in the future. Just search for **Ignite+** and you can assist their study, encourage your families to join in.

We have invited Amelia from UCL Dementia Research Centre, to come and speak at our **AGM in March 2027**. We would love members to fill out the survey which will get reported back in March

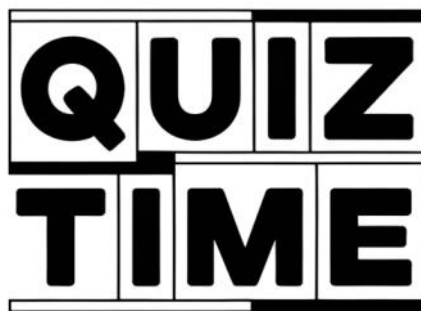

Have You Experienced Fraud by Someone You Know? Your Story Could Help Protect Others

Fraud isn't always committed by strangers. For many people, it's carried out by someone they once trusted, such as a partner, family member, friend, or professional (accountant, carer, etc). These experiences can be complex, painful, and often hidden. Your voice could help change that.

A doctoral researcher at the University of Leicester is conducting an important study to understand how adults aged 65 and over experience and respond to fraud by people they know. The aim is to build a deeper, more compassionate understanding of these situations and to inform future support, safeguarding, and psychological practice.

If you take part, you'll be invited to a confidential interview lasting up to 75 minutes. You can choose to meet in person (East Midlands), online via Microsoft Teams, or by email, whatever feels most comfortable. All personal details will be anonymised, and your identity will be fully protected.

Curtis Tappenden will be hosting a fun, all-day workshop employing the historical and unique processes of monoprinting. Participants will be guided as a group and individually into using 'step-by-step' creative methods with water-based inks and paints to make intriguing one-off prints.

He will also outline the history of monoprinting with examples from famous proponents of the medium.

As the experimental nature of monoprinting means you cannot go wrong, this workshop is not about producing perfect pictures, but about being open to trying out new ways of making art. There is no right or wrong way to create images, and failure is impossible!

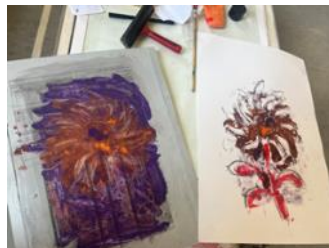
