

Many of you would have experienced changes that the pandemic has left you with – be it a drop in membership numbers, rising cost of halls or having to tempt members to attend organised activities. No longer can we as West Kent Federation book speakers and be 100% sure they will be there on the

We always need a Plan B or even a Plan C! There is also a greater reluctance amongst some of our members to leave home, so we can no longer be certain that halls will be filled for Annual Days and that such events will make the profits they did in the past.

Understandably though the word **change** can strike fear in many of our



members. Everyone likes the familiar – its comfortable and safe and yet we forget that the WI is constantly changing and adapting to the world around it. If it wasn't, it wouldn't have survived for over a hundred years!

I know that the move to a more digital WI has been particularly difficult for some and certainly as a Federation we are very aware that we have members who still wish to have paper copies of the West Kent News and other notices and we are happy to provide these where we can. We offer to help any committee members who would like to embrace social media but might be struggling with online content. I also know that many WIs themselves are offering IT support workshops for members to help them cope in a more digital age. As an organisation we must look forward and embrace changes, even if they might seem difficult at the beginning. I remember back to our first Zoom meetings! It seemed so difficult – but now we routinely have meetings using it and don't give it a second thought!

I was reminded of the WI's capacity to embrace the changing world recently when my husband John and I were clearing his parents' home in Dorset. Sadly, my mother-in- law Sue died 2 years ago and Bob, my father in law, about 8 weeks ago. Sue is the reason I'm standing here today!

She was a member of the WI in Gloucestershire and Hampshire and then a VCO (Voluntary County Organiser) in Dorset and for much of my early married life I was given various WI cookbooks for Christmas and birthday presents! I think this was in the hope that I would eventually join the WI, as well as improve my cooking!

As I was clearing out the cupboards, I came across a photo of Sue at a Dorset AGM many years ago. A very similar stage set up to ours but what I noticed was that everyone was wearing a hat! I can remember helping Sue out at a Federation event and she was referred to as Mrs Breach by many members. It was all much more formal than today where we are all on first name terms and you can wear what you feel most comfortable in. We have changed with the times, as society has become less formal and social barriers have come down. To attract new members, we must reflect the changes in **their** lives- many retired members are also looking after their Grandchildren after school and during the holidays and most women will be working full time for far longer than was the case in the past. These are just two of the changes that we now see, and WIs have adapted meeting times and have formed virtual WIs to ensure that we can offer every woman the opportunity to belong to this amazing organisation.



Belonging to the WI opens up a world of friendship, new experiences, exciting opportunities and the chance to learn about issues of national and local importance, and to feel you can make a difference.

The WI was set up in 1915 to 'ensure that women can take their true role in society' and that is as true today as it was then but to do that, we must reflect the society we live in.

tradition!



King Charles - our Green King

Mention Prince Charles and it brings to mind amusing stories of talking to plants and hugging trees, but in fact he has just been proclaimed by the Washington Post as the 21stC's first Eco-King! A man ahead of his time in his views, he made his first speech, age 21, on the environment in 1970, highlighting pollution. Since then he's been a passionate and often outspoken campaigner for the environment and rural traditions.

He prepared the ground for the first Rio Earth Summit in 1992, bringing influential people together. He addressed the COP 26 Summit 2021 in Glasgow, saying 'I didn't want to be accused by my grandchildren of not doing the things that needed doing at the time.'

He has a formidable knowledge and experience of farming, and converted his farms to Organic practices in the 80's, wanting to work with nature and reduce antibiotic use. He then set up the company Duchy Organics to sell organic foods from small and medium sized producers. All profits from this go to a Charitable Fund, and from the first humble oat biscuit it has grown to become the largest multi-charitable enterprise in the UK. He also led a campaign to promote the versatility of wool in clothing.

He has converted his 50 yr old Aston Martin car to run on surplus white wine and cheese (really!) and installed solar panels on Clarence House.

His life will change as he takes up new responsibilities and he won't be able to speak his mind so freely, but green thinking is so ingrained in him that it must always influence his attitude as King.



Come and Meet the Green Team in the great outdoors to mark Great Big Green Week on Thursday 15 June. We invite you to join us for a walk and a plastic free picnic at Bore Place, between Sevenoaks and Edenbridge.

Last year the CEO of Bore Place gave us a talk for Great Big Green Week and explained how the estate is striving to be sustainable and aiming for net zero. It seems appropriate to now visit this beautiful corner of the countryside and benefit from being in nature for a few hours. The estate is open to the public and there are very well marked walks to follow. One is 2 kms (~ 40 minutes) and the other is 4 kms (just over an hour). Both are fairly easy and no difficult stiles to get over. If walking is not for you, just come along for a picnic -there's a great spot about 10 minutes' stroll from the carpark.

The details:

- Venue Bore Place, Bore Place Road, Chiddingstone, Edenbridge, Kent, TN8 7AR. <u>https://www.boreplace.org/visit/visitor-information/</u>
- Getting there you will need to drive but please car share to minimise your carbon footprint. On arrival follow the signs to the carpark where we will meet you.
- Walk arrive anytime between 10.30am and 11.30am to start the walk. A map and instructions will be provided.
- Picnic bring your own food and drink but <u>no single use</u> plastic. If you are only coming for the picnic, arrive between noon and 12.30pm
- Nearby Chiddingstone is a beautifully preserved Tudor village and often used for period dramas. It is lovely to wander around, not forgetting it has a great café. Also Hever Castle and Gardens and Penshurst Place are both within 5 miles if you want to make more of a day out.
