After successful trials of predominantly using online booking of tickets, West Kent Federation is going over to online

booking for all future specific events. Please note from 29 September all Annual Days will be booked in this format so please be aware there will not be application forms in the West Kent News (does not include Art & Craft Annual Days this year). Bookings should be made via your WI rep who will apply to the ticketing email address — tickets@wkfwi.org.uk — with WI name, contact name, email address and number of tickets.

Points to remember:-

To go in every event advert in West Kent News and on each ticket – 'Speakers can be subject to change without prior

No tickets are issued before the closing date, but please book your tickets early to avoid disappointment. Should an event be oversubscribed your WI may not get all of the tickets applied for, but each WI will receive some tickets.

Please note that tickets will be invoiced to your WI.

Please be aware that tickets are non-refundable and non-returnable.

Once tickets have been allocated they will be charged to your WI and if you can no longer attend it will be your responsibility to find a replacement.

Each ticket has a unique code to prevent fraudulent use.

lease remember to bring your ticket – failure to do so could result in entry being refused.

If you do not have a pre-ordered ticket, ID will be required so that the correct WI can be contacted and charged for

If a day is oversubscribed and members turn up who have not been allocated tickets, they will only be admitted if space has become available due to non-attendance and proof of ID will be required.



King Charles's ideas applied in Pratts Bottom

Pratts Bottom WI has joined with some other community groups in the village to act on some ideas of our new King Charles III. The former head teacher at the village school, who is one of our WI members has encouraged some of the locals to pursue the "Coronation Gardens for Food and Nature" idea. A petition was organised to improve the local playground and as the project ideas came together some funding was secured. The village school children as the next generation of environmentalists, came up with proposals to create a natural meadow on an embankment just outside the school grounds in this local playground.

This natural meadow will be planted with wild seeds and plants, hopefully involving the children directly. Such planting will encourage Butterflies, Bees & other insects, and create an area of floral diversity that everyone can learn from. This meadow will sit alongside the refurbished playground which will give the next generation the opportunity to have some fun as well as admire nature at work. There are plans afoot to install a bench in the meadow area where ideas for Food & Nature can be discussed by all age groups.

A little further along this project is the idea to go into the immediate neighbouring patch of land, known as "Foxes Wood", to tidy it up and make it "child safe" again. This will be done in a sympathetic way to highlight naturally occurring flora & fauna. This will be another way of recognising the natural world where food for the fauna will grow and the next generation of environmentalists can learn more about.

How many; well, we put 75 photos in our book, but we know there are many more than that number.

It would be interesting to do a survey in the spring or even July to see which wildflowers are out brightening up our world at different times of year.
