The Corbett WI Craft Group had great fun designing a tactile children's book

that can be shared by visually impaired and sighted children and adults. It is based on the nursery rhyme One, Two, Buckle My Shoe, with a slight variation on the last line. The pages of the book are colourful and have braille, print and tactile objects designed for helping develop the touch skills children need to learn braille. We tried to make each of our objects feel different and interactive by using a variety of materials. For example, the door has a metal knocker, we



made a bag full of sticks, the gate opens, and on the last page there is a very colourful and tactile hen. The book was presented to our local education service for children with vision impairment who were delighted with it. You can find more information on similar

What is composting?

Compost is a mixture of ingredients used as plant fertilizer and to improve soil's physical, chemical, and biological properties. It is commonly prepared by decomposing plant and food waste, recycling organic materials, and manure. The resulting mixture is rich in plant nutrients and beneficial organisms, such as bacteria, protozoa, nematodes, and fungi. At the simplest level, composting requires gathering a mix of green waste (nitrogen-rich materials such as leaves, grass, and food scraps) and brown waste (woody materials rich in carbon, such as stalks, paper, and wood chips).

Anyone can get involved in composting, it doesn't matter how big or small your garden is, or if you live in a flat and don't have a garden you can still get into composting. Some communities create their

own compositing area near their flats, etc. for their communal gardens. Allotments are usually a source of useful information and actual compost from the allotment holders. There are even some "Compost Clubs" in existence where folk get together and collect and manage their own composting arrangements. One benefit of composting is where people get out into the fresh air and take some exercise whilst working on their own piles of compost.

Nature will also help with your composting by having earthworms, ants, grubs millipedes etc burrowing and digesting the compost ingredients and transforming compost materials into more fertile material.

All sorts of containers can be used for composting. Simple wooden frames that separate the different stages of composting work well, as do simple brick or concrete structures. Even large plastic containers can be used in the production of the finished compost.


Yes, it can be a bit smelly at times but the end results of healthier and happy plants is worth the effort, and can be very satisfying.
